



## **P2P at the 2026 World Basin Summit: a political and technical platform for the project**

### **Peer-to-Peer (P2P) Session (June 16, morning 9:40 a.m. – 1:10 p.m.) - From selection to cooperation content: structuring and fostering partnerships**

The Peer-to-Peer (P2P) project is the first program of the “Twin Basin Initiative,” led by the International Network of Basin Organizations (INBO), with the support of the African Network of Basin Organizations (ANBO). This project is funded by the European Union.

Beyond the presentation of P2P, the goal of the morning session is to demonstrate that the project has entered an operational phase of concrete cooperation among basin organizations. The session will thus alternate between:

- institutional and policy context;
- concrete examples provided by peers;
- sharing initial feedback;
- outlook on the next stages of the project.

#### **1.1. 9:45 AM – 11:00 AM: Peer-to-Peer (P2P) Presentation Session – INBO project to support river basin organizations and facilitate peer-to-peer exchanges, conducted in cooperation with RAOB**

#### **Objectives:**

- This first session aims to review the general framework of the P2P project, based on structured mutual assistance among basin organizations, as well as the role of the P2P Secretariat in facilitating pairings. It will also provide an opportunity for several peers to speak, offering concrete examples of their expectations and the initial dynamics that have emerged since the selection phase.

#### **Expected results and deliverables:**

- The discussions should help identify initial lessons learned from the experiences presented, highlighting certain success factors as well as areas requiring attention.
- The goal is to gradually build a shared understanding of the conditions for implementing the pairings, which can then be consolidated in the form of a summary.

#### **Session content:**

- Discussions will focus in particular on how the pairings were established, the respective expectations of the partners, and the initial avenues for cooperation identified. Presentations will use concrete examples to illustrate the dynamics at work and the operational issues that arise prior to the more formal structuring of action plans.

#### **Objectives:**

This provides a specific opportunity for dialogue on lessons learned, which is one of the objectives of the P2P project.

Each partnership will also be asked to produce a summary note on the lessons learned regarding the presented themes. This content will be shared after the event with all P2P project partners, in line with the initiative's consolidation approach.

#### **Expected results and deliverables:**

- Approach and knowledge transfer beyond the operational structure of P2P presented in the first part of the session
- Initial Feedback
- Contribute to the P2P learning pathway on governance, legal and institutional frameworks, and SfNs.
- Deliverables: collective recommendations; regional knowledge-sharing note produced by the Latin America Module on the topics covered.

#### **Workshop content:**

Discussions will revolve around two thematic panels dedicated, on the one hand, to governance and the legal and institutional frameworks of river basin organizations, and on the other hand, to nature-based solutions. Through feedback from partnerships in the Latin America and Caribbean region, this workshop will facilitate the exchange of approaches, the discussion of concrete practices, and the identification of shared lessons. It will also provide a space for peer-to-peer dialogue on topics of shared interest, helping to enrich the P2P project's learning journey and lay the groundwork for collective knowledge-sharing.
